- 10 Account for the popularity of second-hand fashion such as clothing, furniture, or other accessories.
- 11 With reference to **two** animated films, assess their artistic value.
- 12 If you were drawing up a short-list of **three** structures to be celebrated at the World Architecture Festival, how would **you** justify **your** choices?
